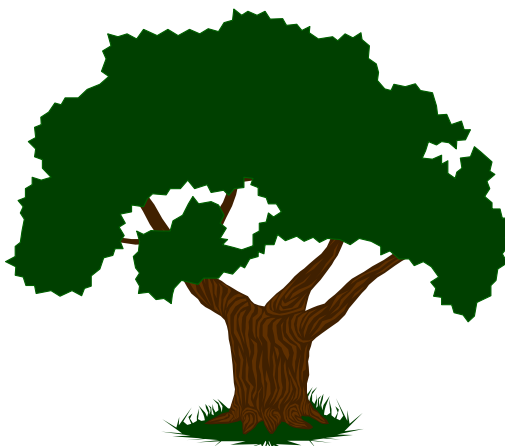

Preston Primary School Covenant

**I have a right to be happy and to be treated with kindness in this school.
This means that no-one will laugh at me, ignore me, or hurt my feelings.**

**I have a right to be myself in this school.
This means that no-one will treat me unfairly because I am fat or thin, fast or slow, boy or girl.**

**I have a right to be safe in this school.
This means that no-one will hit me, kick me, push me, pinch me or threaten me**

**I have a right to hear and be heard in this school.
This means that no-one will yell, scream or shout and my opinions and desires will be considered in any plans we make.**

**I have a right to learn about myself in this school.
This means that I will have opportunities to express my opinions without being interrupted or criticised.**

Our Golden Rules

Do be kind and helpful
Do be gentle
Do listen

Do work hard
Do be honest
Do look after property

School Rules –

Indoor

1. We follow instructions
2. We keep our hands, feet and objects to ourselves
3. We ask permission to leave the room
4. We walk when moving around the school
5. We talk with quiet voices inside

Outdoor

1. We follow instructions.
2. We keep our hands, feet and objects to ourselves (no fun fighting).
3. We don't tease or swear.
4. We ask permission to cross the yellow boundary line outside

Praise and rewards

Examples:

- * Spoken praise
- * Stamps
- * Points and Chance Certificates
- * Notes to parents
- * Recognition in our Celebration Assembly
- * Marbles Jar for whole class / team effort

Marbles / Target Chart

Each class will have a jar and a box of marbles or a target chart for good deeds, good behaviour, good work etc. a child can earn a marble to be put in the jar or a sticker for the chart. When the jar or chart is full, the whole class can choose a reward.....e.g. extra playtime, a drink of juice, to bring a game to school.

Chance Certificates

Chance Certificates will be given out each lunchtime, for positive behaviour. These will go into a box with the child's name written on the certificate and the reason why it was given. During the Friday's Celebration Assembly, two Chance Certificates will be drawn from the box and the children will each receive a reward.

Star Pupil

Every week each class is asked to nominate a pupil to receive a 'Star Pupil' Certificate. The pupils must give reasons why the pupil has been nominated examples of which are working hard, good listening, following instructions, producing a good / excellent piece of work etc. The final decision rests with the Class Teacher.

The Star Pupil will be announced during Friday's Celebration Assembly. The following Monday the child will be presented with a special certificate which has their photograph on it. This is to be displayed in the child's class until the end of the week when they may take it home.

Consequences

If your child chooses not to follow the rules:

1. Warning with name written down.
2. Second warning tick against their name . Pupil placed in Lunch Club to complete a 'Think Sheet' or other work. Length of time at the Teachers discretion.
3. Sent to work in allocated class JB – JM, JM – AR, AR – DC, DC – JC, JC - JM.
4. Sent to the Head Teacher

Severe Clause.

5. The Head Teacher will immediately contact the parents, leading to discussion and possible exclusion from school.
