Remembrance Day

Every year, we hold a two-minute silence at 11am on the 11th day of the 11th month to remember those who have died in any conflict.

On Thursday, 11th November, all our children and staff paid their respects. Every child made their own individual poppy which was then included in a class wreath.





All of the children, from the Reception class up to Year 6, walked down to Eaglescliffe war memorial in Tittybottle Park, to observe two minutes' silence and lay their wreaths.

Our School Governors

The Governors are a group of people drawn from the staff, parents and the community who work together for the benefit of our school.

The Governors serving on our Local Governing Body are accountable to the Trustees (who in turn are accountable to the Department for Education) as well as to the communities they serve. Whilst not Trustees under charity law, nevertheless, the Governors are under a duty to act in good faith and in the best interests of their school and Lingfield Education Trust.

The aim of the Governors at Preston Primary is to work with the staff in helping the children achieve their full potential in a happy and caring environment.

This duty includes a responsibility to do the following:

- To ensure their Academy complies with its legal obligations.
- To fulfil the charitable object of Lingfield Education Trust.
- To set targets, monitor pupil progress and attainment, and to challenge the Head teacher and Senior Leadership Team (SLT) to achieve the objectives of their Academy.
- To act with integrity, to avoid any personal conflicts of interest and not to misuse any charitable funds or assets of their Academy or Trust.
- To act prudently in the financial management of their Academy, avoiding putting any assets, funds or the reputation of their Academy or the Trustees at undue risk

Did you know we have a school allotment?

For a number of years, we have rented an allotment at Quarry Road. Each year, one

year group takes responsibility for looking after the allotment, with the dedicated help of Mr Gibb, whose grandchildren used to attend the school.

The children walk down to the allotment from school, taking their trugs and tools, and learn how to prepare the ground, sow seeds and look after the plants until they are ready to be picked. The main harvest usually takes place when the children return



after the summer holidays, after which the next year group start their allotment year.

- Who runs it? A Committee is elected each year at the Annual General Meeting to manage the funds and activities of the PTA.
- How often does the Committee meet? The Committee meetings are generally held once a month, in school, during term time. All parents/carers and teachers are welcome at any meeting. The AGM is held every September.
- How much would be expected of me if I were to get involved? It is entirely up to you; you can contribute an idea, help at an event or activity, come along to a meeting, or become a Committee member.
